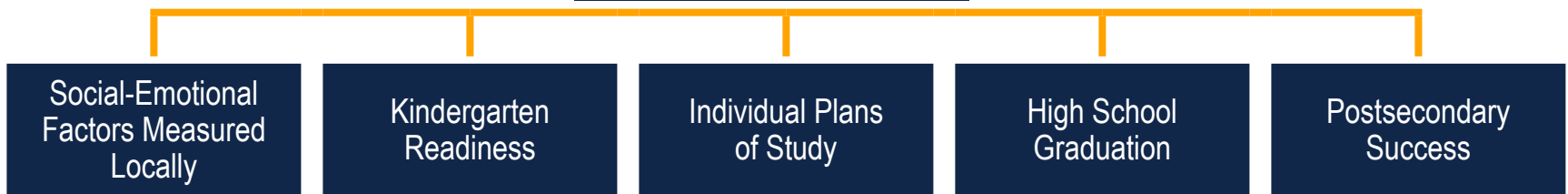
## Successful High School Graduate

A successful Kansas high school graduate has the

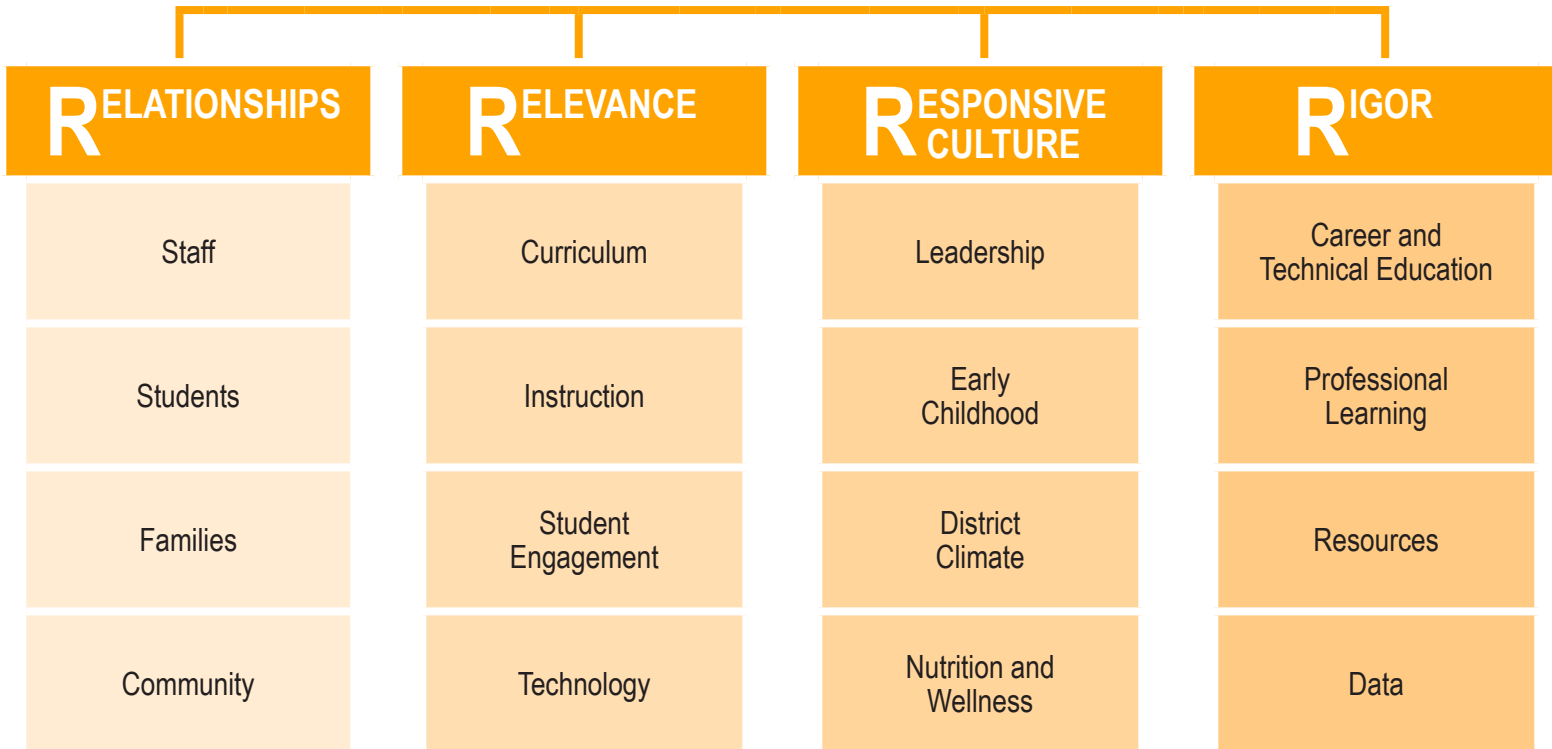

to be successful in postsecondary education, in the attainment of an industry recognized certification, or in the workforce, without the need for remediation.

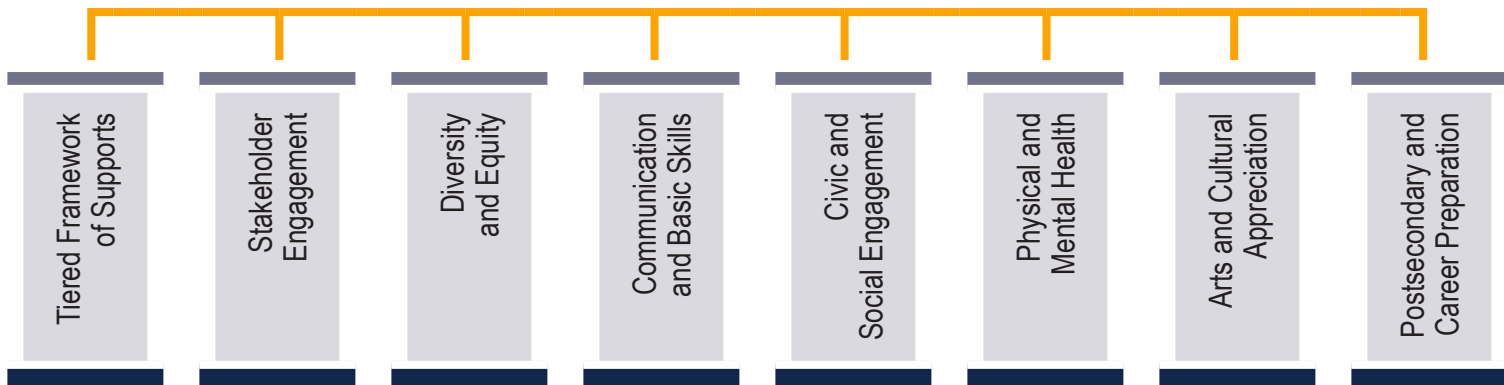
