While some of these numbers show slight reductions from the previous year due to the decrease and/or cancellation of many in-person activities, overall engagement has continued to grow. These numbers show the resilience of educators and students, and enduring dedication to inclusion.

FUNDING

SOUCS is funded in large part by the Office of Special Education Programs at the U.S. Department of Education. From 2008-2021, over the 13 years of Unified Champion Schools programming, \$133 million in funding has been received from OSEP. Special Olympics state Programs, through their fundraising efforts, have contributed \$142 million in cash and VIK.
